PREPARING FOR BED BUG TREATMENTS

Your unit will be chemically treated for Bed Bugs on _____ at about _____

Prior to the treatment, it is essential that you prepare as follows:

1. Be ready to leave your residence once the technician arrives and remain out of the residence for 2 hours after the treatment has taken place. Remove all pets, fish or animals.
2. **NO clothing should be in piles, on the floor, or stacked in the closets.**
3. **ALL** food items must be stored in cabinets or refrigerator. **NO Food** should be left open **ANYWHERE** in the entire residence.
4. Furniture with **severe** infestations may need to be disposed of.
5. Your residence **MUST BE CLEAN** in order to receive treatment. **ALL** dishes washed, put away, counters cleared of clutter and **ALL** trash removed.
6. Report to us ANY allergies or sensitivities that you or your family may have.

AFTER TREATMENT, you need to do this:

1. **ALL** clothes and bedding (including additional blankets and comforters) **MUST** be washed, bagged in **NEW** bags and sealed. Wash **ALL** items in **HOT** water and dried in **hot heat** for a minimum of 20 minutes.
2. **Vacuum ALL Rooms, on ALL floors, ALL furniture, ALL mattresses and box springs.**
DISPOSE OF VACCUM BAG IMMEDIATELY AFTER!!!

Treatment Description:

- This is a 2 or sometimes 3 Phase treatment process. We will ask that you complete this prep before each phase of the treatment plan.
- The service technician(s) will apply a residual liquid insecticide formulation to the cracks, crevices and seams of the mattresses, bed frames, upholstered furniture, infested draperies, night stands and baseboards.
- An insecticide dust formulation will be injected into the lower utility penetrations in the wall voids.
- You may continue to see a few bugs for several days after your residence has been treated. This is normal, and during the time between phase 1 and phase 2 most common.
- We will return again in 7-14 days to complete the same treatment once again.
